#### 1993 AGM November 29th

A bitterly cold night, a disappointingly low turn out of members (fifteen in fact) arrived for this our fifth AGM. After last years minutes were read and approved, the various officers gave their reports. Pauline Parker reported a healthy bank balance in spite of one member (now ex-member) not paying a club clothing bill of nearly £100!! From the reports it does appear that Team Cambridge had more success at time trials than road racing. Kevin Parker was cited at having started the season with some good results on the road scene, but drifted away as the season progressed. Racing secretary Paul Millard who also had a poor season due to knee problems, hopes that the coming 1994 season will see a change in our fortunes. Kevin Parker reported that the 'cross season is now well under way, but only about three members have made the attempt to ride them. Angela Parker stated that curent membership stood at 46, of which 33 are first claim. (where were you all tonight? - ED) The committee for 1994 was duly elected and are as follows:-

From the above list you will note that we did not elect anyone to the position of newsletter editor, I have (until most of 1993) looked after The Spokesman for the past five years, it is unfortunate that I will not be available for much of forthcoming year. Pauline Parker has produced three editions during 1993, I feel that it is time for someone to assist/takeover this very important job. Any offers?????

It was elected not to change the rules regarding the Senior and Ladies BAR trophies. These will remain at 50,100 & 12hr and 25,50 & 100 miles respectively. It was however decided to introduce a middle distance trophy for both ladies and senior riders. Ladies competing over 10, 25 & 50 miles, with seniors having 25,50 & 100 miles. (Do we really need this additional senior trophy, after all we do have our FEN cup at 10,25 & 50 miles..ED) The Under-18 BAR was changed to RTTC style two 10 mile and two 25 mile time trials.

The major change to the Club's event was proposed by Paul Millard (and accepetd on the whole) that in future only 10 events will count towards the TransMedia Shield. There are approx 14-15 events on our calender, members will pick their 10 best rides through-out the season to claim points for. This is meant to give a chance to riders that perhaps would miss an event or two during the season.

There is one catch however, members will be expected to assist at events if and when they decide not to ride. I will include new points system on our end of year claim form, judging by the amount of replies that I received this year, even I have a chance of winning.

Paul Millard displayed our new club badges, which have been especially made from a design from last year. These badges will be available to members to purchase on key fobs etc, and will be included on the years standards madals
